



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
ORDER

For the reasons stated in a contemporaneously filed Memorandum Opinion, Syngenta's Updated Motion for Leave to Amend and Supplement its Complaint [Doc. #120] is GRANTED in full. Therefore, the following two motions are rendered MOOT: Syngenta's previous Motion for Leave to Amend and Supplement its Complaint and for Substitution of Party [Doc. #106], and EPA's Motion for Leave to Amend its Answer [Doc. #73]. Further, Syngenta's unopposed Motion to Dismiss all Claims against TRI and for the Withdrawal of TRI from the Case

[Doc. #80] is GRANTED. Drexel's Motion for Joinder [Doc. #58] is GRANTED.

Finally, EPA's Motion for Supplementation of the Administrative Record [Doc. #76] is GRANTED. Remaining pending motions in this matter will be addressed in future memorandum opinions.
