MOTION TO SEAL EXAMPLES

The Sealed Document Guidelines provide assistance to litigants on how to file documents when 1) redaction is required for personal identifiers; 2) sealing is allowed without a motion to seal; and 3) sealing requires a motion to seal. Of these three categories, the procedures are the most complicated when filing a motion to seal. To help visualize how the guidelines would work within CM/ECF, the following example shows how a brief and attachments with confidential information could be filed in CM/ECF.

BASIC STEPS

The procedures for requesting a motion to seal a document have four basic steps. First, the filer should file public/redacted versions of all documents. For our example, a brief with confidential information in the brief and two of four attachments would be filed in CM/ECF with the "Brief" docketing event and would appear as follows:

Second, the filer should file a Motion to Seal, which is a public document.

Third, file a Brief and, if required, an affidavit. Both of these documents can be filed under seal using the "Sealed Brief" docketing event. If the filer has a confidentiality interest in the documents, the filer should submit the brief. If another party has a confidentiality interest in the documents, the other party should file the brief within 14 days of filing the motion to seal.

Fourth, the filer should file all unredacted documents, using the "Sealed Unredacted Documents" event. Using the previous example, the CM/ECF docketing would appear as follows (document 54 would be the brief):

STEPS WHERE PARTIES HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO CONFER PURSUANT TO LR 5.4(c)

The order of these steps would change if the filer is submitting a document in which another party has a confidentiality interest <u>and</u> it was not possible for the filer to timely confer with the party claiming confidentiality and prepare a redacted version of the documents. In that instance, the filer would perform the following steps:

First, file all documents under seal (including documents to be redacted in the future and related documents not previously docketed) using the "Sealed Unredacted Documents Event." Using the previous example, the CM/ECF docketing would appear as follows (document 52 would be the brief):

Second, file a Motion for Extension of Time to Confer and File Redacted Documents. This would be a public document.

Third, the filer should file a Motion to Seal, which is a public document. The other party having a confidentiality interest in the documents will still have 14 days from the filing of this motion to submit their brief unless the Court orders otherwise.

Fourth, after the parties have met and prepared the redacted documents, file all public versions of the documents previously filed under seal. Using our example, the filer would use the CM/ECF "Brief" event, which would appear as follows:

Fifth, file unredacted copies of the redacted documents, with the redactions highlighted or marked to show what portions of the documents have been redacted, using the "Sealed Unredacted Documents Event." Using the previous example, the CM/ECF docketing would appear as follows (document 56 would be the brief):
