

For good cause, this Court adopts this Order for managing requests for civil case subpoenas from *pro se* litigants.

If a *pro se* litigant seeks the issuance of a subpoena outside the court-ordered discovery deadlines, the *pro se* litigant shall file a motion requesting issuance of the subpoena and include an explanation of the need for the subpoena.

If a pro se litigant has been granted In Forma Pauperis status and is requesting a Subpoena to Appear and Testify at a Deposition (AO-88A) or a Subpoena to Appear and Testify at a Hearing or Trial (AO-88), the pro se litigant shall file a motion requesting issuance of the subpoena and demonstrate that the litigant is financially able to tender the required witness fees and mileage allowed by law.

In all other instances, a *pro se* litigant may request the issuance of a subpoena in person at the Clerk's Office at 324 W. Market St, Fourth Floor, Greensboro, NC 27401 or by mail. A request by mail must include 1) a cover letter containing the request for a subpoena, including the case name and case number, 2) a subpoena form (AO-88, AO-88A or AO-88B), and 3) a self-addressed stamped envelope.

This Order shall be effective immediately.
